

2009-10 Yearbook Individual Achievement Awards

■ **Submit one (1) entry in each of the following category.**

- A. THEME SELECTION & DEVELOPMENT** — Entry should include cover design, end sheets, title page, introductory spread or spreads, division pages and conclusion/closing and other pages that develop theme. Do not send the entire book.
- B. CAPTIONS** — Entry must include five (5) captions with photos. Captions/photos can be from any section of the yearbook.
- C. HEADLINES** — Entry must include five (5) headlines with story. Headlines/story can be from any section of the yearbook.

■ **Submit no more than two (2) entries in each of the following categories.**

- D. GENERAL INTEREST SPREAD** — The may come from any section, should not be posed, and should feature people and action. You may not submit the same entry for this category and any other category.
- E. STUDENT LIFE SPREAD** — A spread from the student life section. The student life spread tells the informal story of the special interests of the student.
- F. SPORTS SPREAD** — A spread from the sports section.
- G. ACADEMIC SPREAD** — The spread may include administration/faculty coverage but avoids stereotyped class scenes in favor of actual portrayal of students engaged in the educational process.
- H. CLASS SECTION SPREAD** — A spread from the class section (also known as people section).
- I. CLUB/ORGANIZATION SPREAD** — A spread from club/organization section. Emphasis on action and specific writing — not goals, purposes, aims, etc.
- J. AD SPREAD** — A spread from the advertising section, complete with student-designed ads and secondary coverage.
- K. INDEX SPREAD** — A spread from the index.
- L. SECONDARY COVERAGE GRAPHIC** — Submit a info-graphic from any one section of the yearbook.
- M. STUDENT LIFE FEATURE STORY** — Two stories from the student life section.
- N. ACADEMIC FEATURE STORY** — Two stories from the academic section.
- O. SPORTS FEATURE STORY** — Two stories from the sports section.
- P. CLUB AND ORGANIZATION FEATURE STORY** — Two stories from the club/organization section.
- Q. PERSONALITY PROFILE STORY** — Two stories that feature a student/staff/community member (from any section).

PHOTOGRAPHY — Enter original prints or reproduced photo from yearbook for each category. You are urged to include a laser copy of the photo if you submit a reproduced photo. Photos taken with digital cameras should be submitted as laser prints with a high quality printer. If you enter a photo taken with a digital camera, you MAY include with your entries a CD with an image of the entry along with the printed copy. TWO entries per category. NOTE: Photos submitted as newspaper IAAs last spring may not be entered in fall yearbook competition. Caption information MUST be included.

- R. SPORTS ACTION PHOTO** — You may enter two photos. Action dominated. Well cropped, in focus with excellent tonal quality. **Include caption information.**
- S. SPORTS FEATURE PHOTO** — You may enter two photos. The unusual, interesting photo. Cropped tightly, in focus with excellent tonal quality. **Include caption information.**
- T. ACADEMIC PHOTO** — You may enter two photos. Human interest photo with emphasis on students during the school day. Posed shots and portraits avoided. **Include caption information.**
- U. STUDENT LIFE PHOTO** — You may enter two photos. Human interest photo with emphasis on students involved in events outside the classroom. Posed shots and portraits avoided. **Include caption information.**
- V. CLUB/ORGANIZATION PHOTO** — You may enter two photos. Human interest photo with emphasis on students involved in club events outside the classroom. Posed shots and portraits avoided. **Include caption information.**
- W. PORTRAIT** — You may enter two photos. A posed photograph of one or more people, either in a studio setting or in an environment that explains something about the person. The entry should capture a sense of who the people are in the photograph. **Include caption information.**

Contest Rules

- Submit entries from the 2008-2009 school yearbook. All work must be that of a student and published in the 2008-09 school yearbook.
- Photos must be taken by students and **only one student can take a photo**. Students need not have printed and processed the film. NOTE: Photos submitted in newspaper IAA competition last spring may not be entered in the fall yearbook competition.
- All entries become the property of ILPC, may be published in ILPC or UIL materials, and cannot be returned.
- Entries (other than photos) may be tear sheets from published books or duplicate copies of pages from the book. Duplicate copies must be readable and show photos clearly. Do not send the entire page or spread for a copy entry. Cut out or copy just the story and submit that with the required information on the back.
- Photo entries should contain the following: the photo reproduced in the book and the original print, or the photo reproduced in the book and a laserprinted copy. You can submit only one (either the print or the reproduction from the book), if that is all you have, but the judges prefer both. Captions should be included with the photo entry. **If you send in the original photo print, it is not necessary to submit a digitized reproduction.** For more explanation feel free to call the ILPC office.
- Entries must be identified on the back with the name of the student, school, publication, city, conference and publication date. Each entry must carry this statement signed by the adviser: "To the best of my knowledge, this is the work of the student named."
- Using a glue stick, spray adhesive or scotch tape, attach entries on white paper or tape facing pages of the spread together. Tape completed entry form to back of entry. Do not use staples or paper clips. **DO NOT AFFIX ENTRIES TO POSTER BOARDS.**
- Multiple page entries must be connected so it is clear to judges what is to be judged. Do not send a complete book, with instructions for the judge to thumb through looking for various entries. Remove the entry and paste it up as outlined earlier. In the case of a theme development entry, remove each section and staple or tape them together in the order in which they appear in the book. Do not paper-clip or staple. Tape or use a spray or stick adhesive.
- Each entry will be judged in its respective conference. Failure to signify your conference or signify an incorrect conference may result in disqualification. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded to first, second and third place, respectively. Results will be announced at the ILPC State Convention at The University of Texas at Austin.
- **All entries from your school must be mailed in one envelope and clearly marked YEARBOOK IAA ENTRIES.** Submit all entries to:
